Update from the Fisheries Department!

The salmon forecasts for Area 23 are available on our website.

The expected return of sockeye for 2017 is in the “critical” zone. The ‘sibling model’ has performed the best in recent years and this forecast of 172,000 will be used for planning purposes.

At this rate of return there will be no commercial, food, social and ceremonial or recreational fisheries happening

A limited Test Fishery will be operated in Alberni Inlet for stock assessment purposes.

Fisheries Notice: Frozen Halibut Distribution

Hupacasath First Nation is planning to hold a distribution of frozen glazed halibut. Currently this distribution is planned for Friday April 21st, 2017. It is anticipated that a check in period will be run from 11 AM till Noon and distribution will happen at Noon.

The process will be similar to the procedures followed for sockeye distributions. A check in period will be followed by the distribution of fish. **If you are unable to pick up your share of frozen halibut you will be permitted to designate another member to collect your share.** A completed authorization form or signed letter will be required and can be presented to fish day staff at the time of pick-up.

All of the frozen halibut will be distributed to those who have checked in. So if you would like a share of this halibut you must be present or make arrangements with another member to collect your share.

Depending on the number attending the distribution it is anticipated that there will be approximately 10lbs of halibut per person available. The fish is glazed so please bring your own clean containers and bags to transport your fish.

General Job Description

We are seeking workers to do various jobs in forestry silviculture

Responsibilities include:

Planting: Planting goes by a piece rate, cents / seedling planted.

Coning: Application of protectors over cedar seedlings to protect from deer browsing. Paid /cone application, this includes hammering stake in ground and securing protectors properly.

Brushing and weeding: Only certified saw operators will run power saws, pay will be based on experience and production. Hand brushing using manual tools will be supplied.

Safety gear and Essential Functions:

- Must have all personal protective equipment (PPR) boots, hard hat, hi vis, rain gear gloves.
- To protect cedar seedlings and release seedlings planted from being choked out by competing vegetation.
- Packing tools and or supplies into thick brushy terrain with uneven ground and or up steep slopes.
- Ability to work with people.
- Physical ability to perform duties as required.
- Work in adverse weather conditions.
- Must be prepared to run into wildlife such as bears.
- Bee stings are very common as nests are frequently discovered, if allergic to bee stings it must be known prior to working so appropriate bee sting first aid kits are on site.
- Must supply own Lunch and water daily.
